RE: ILLINOIS ADJUSTABLE BLOCK PROGRAM DRAFT GUIDEBOOK

PROGRAM ADMINISTRATOR:

OneEnergy Development, LLC (“OneEnergy”) requests clarification on the following issues related to the Adjustable Block Program (“ABP”) Draft Guidebook:

- Will Approved Vendors need to submit all items described under Required Information: Part I (p. 23) when the program opens in January? Or are some of these items required only later in the development process?
- Will community solar project applications be required to submit the name and contact information associated with the project installer? For most community solar projects, this data request is premature.
- Will community solar project applications be required to complete a shading study, or is this upload requirement specific to distributed generation systems? If required, will the output from a software program like PVgis (http://re.jrc.ec.europa.eu/pvg_tools/en/tools.html) be sufficient?
- Could you please confirm that “Proof that the brochure was provided to the customer” is not a required upload for community solar projects?
- Could you please provide a sample “Plot diagram or site-map” that makes clear exactly what level of detail is required for community solar projects?
- What information is requested in the “description of the proposed subscription model” for the Part I of a community solar project application?
- What penalty, if any, will be imposed on Approved Vendors that receive a REC allocation via the ABP but then fail to execute the tendered REC contract?

We appreciate the opportunity to provide comments on this matter and look forward to ongoing processes related to the Adjustable Block Program’s implementation.
